United: One Name

In John 13-17, Jesus gives his last words to his disciples before His death. What's the last thing He does in this famous last discourse in the upper room? He prays. And in His prayer, Jesus gives us a window into something that He was completely committed to... something He was so passionate about... something that He wanted not just for His followers that day but for us today: Jesus prays that we would be UNITED. What does that look like, and what are the implications for each of us? Over the next three weeks, we'll look at Jesus' profound prayer and the difference it makes.

- What excuses do we use for not pursuing unity with people who are different from us?
- In light of what's going on in our world right now, do you think this passage of Scripture is timely for us to learn from? Why or why not?
