# WHAT IS GOD'S ROLE IN SALVATION?

Soteriology



### **IMPORTANT TERMS**

**Soteriology** – the study of the doctrine of Salvation

**Calvinism** – the theological system of John Calvin which emphasizes the sovereignty and glory of God.

**Arminianism** – the theological system of Jacob Arminius which emphasizes the responsible free will of man.

**Provisionism** – the theological system which bridges the Calvinist-Arminian gap.



# GFC DOCTRINAL STATEMENT

#### We believe in...

The dignity and brokenness of all people created in God's image to live in love and holiness, but alienated from God and each other because of our sin and guilt, and justly subject to God's wrath.

Jesus Christ, fully human and fully divine who lived a perfect life, who took upon Himself the judgment due sinners on the cross, who was bodily raised from the dead, and ascended as Savior and Lord.




# THE GREAT DEBATE





# TOTAL DEPRAVITY

- As a result of Adam's sin, the entire human race is fallen Romans 5:12
- All humanity is dead in trespasses and sins Eph 2:1-3
- Each person's will is in bondage to sin Genesis 6:5
- Each is incapable of responding to God's offer of salvation Rom 3:10-18



# UNCONDITIONAL ELECTION

- Because man is dead in sin and unable to respond to God, in eternity past God chose (elected) certain people to be given faith and salvation.
- This choice was apart from any action or quality in that person, but **solely from God's good pleasure** to elect them (and therefore to non elect others).
- Romans 8:29-30; 9:11; Eph 1:4-6; 11-12



# LIMITED ATONEMENT

- Jesus died on the cross **only for the elect**; His atoning work is limited and not for all.
- Had Jesus died for everyone, then everyone would be saved (universalism).
- Acts 20:28; Romans 8:32; Eph 5:25



# RRESISTIBLE GRACE

- God draws the elect to Himself by giving these spiritually dead individuals life (regeneration). ("Effectual Calling")
- This regeneration makes one willing to have faith in Jesus.
- The person cannot resist this exercising saving faith.
- The non-elect will remain guilty of sin and experience eternal punishment.
- John 6:37, 44; 10:16



# PERSEVERANCE OF THE SAINTS

- The elect are regenerated, drawn to Christ, given the gift of saving faith, and continue in their faith to the end.
- We're saved by faith alone; but faith that saves is not alone.
- 100% of God and 0% of the individual, so that He gets ALL the glory.
- John 10:27-29; Romans 8:29; James 2:14-17



# AN "INCONSISTENT" CALVINIST

It's difficult to consistently live out Calvinistic beliefs.

Here are Common Trouble Areas:

- God causes everything even all evil
- God condemns the non-elect though they could not believe
- God doesn't love everyone, only the elect
- God has two loves, two wills, two calls, two gospels.
- God regenerates a person before they exercise faith



# AN "INCONSISTENT" CALVINIST

# The Inconsistency of Four-Point Calvinism

Calvinism isn't a produce stand from which we can pick and choose which doctrines we wish to keep and pass over the rest in a sort of hermeneutical reprobation. Calvinism is an interwoven system of theology which must be accepted or rejected as a whole.

### GOD'S SOVEREIGNTY

### Westminster Confession:

God, from all eternity, did, by the most wise and holy counsel of his own will, freely, and unchangeably ordains whatsoever comes to pass:

yet so, as thereby **neither is God the author of sin**, nor is violence offered to the will of the creatures; nor is the liberty or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather established.



### GOD'S SOVEREIGNTY

# Westminster Confession:

By the decree of God, for the manifestation of his glory, some men and angels are **predestinated unto everlasting** life, and others fore-ordained to everlasting death.



# JOHN CALVIN ON PREDESTINATION

"By predestination we mean the eternal decree of God, by which he <u>determined</u> with himself whatever he wished to happen with regard to every man.

All are not created on equal terms, but some are <u>preordained</u> to eternal life, others to eternal damnation;

and, accordingly, as each has been created for one or other of these ends, we say that he has been <u>predestinated</u> to life or to death."

# POSITIVE ASPECTS OF CALVINISM

- Champion God's glory and His sovereignty
- Commitment to Jesus Christ and His redeeming work
- Commitment to inerrancy and authority of Scripture
- Passion for preaching and teaching God's word
- Call to Lordship of Christ and growing in righteousness



### PROBLEM AREAS IN CALVINISM

- How is one responsible for choices if God decrees their choice?
- How can the lost be damned for rejecting what they could never accept?
- How is God good if He ultimately is the cause behind all evil?
- How does one know for sure they are one of the elect?
- How can you know you are saved until you persevere to end?



### PROBLEM AREAS IN CALVINISM

- How is God "not wanting any to perish" if He is the one who creates them to be "vessels of destruction"?
- How does regeneration precede faith so that you are first born again before you believe?
- How is faith a "work" when Gal 3:5 and Romans 3:27 say faith is not a work?
- How could free will and God's sovereignty co-exist before the Fall but cannot after the Fall?



# SUMMARY OF CALVINIST VIEW

- God gets ALL the glory because salvation is ALL of Him, and nothing of mankind.
- God elects, regenerates, calls, draws, gifts with faith, forgives, justifies, glorifies.



## ARMINIANISM ALTERNATIVE

Believes that humanity is depraved but able to believe with the help of prevenient grace.

Anyone can be saved by believing in Christ, but can resist God's call to salvation, and even lose their salvation if they turn away from the Lord.

True faith is verified and sustained by good works. Salvation is synergistic – God works together with the individual.



## PROVISIONISM ALTERNATIVE

Believes that all are sinful and separated from God but able to turn to Christ in faith.

Salvation is conditioned on faith and all who have this faith are predestined to everlasting life- eternally secure apart from works.

Salvation is monergistic – God provides a finished work of salvation which an individual accepts or rejects.
