John Calvin 1509-1564




Jacob Arminius 1560-1609







THREE SOTERIOLOGICAL VIEWS

Calvinism

Provisionism Arminianism









IMPORTANT TERMS

Soteriology – the study of the doctrine of Salvation


Calvinism – the theological system of John Calvin which emphasizes the sovereignty and glory of God.

Arminianism – the theological system of Jacob Arminius which emphasizes the responsible free will of man.

Provisionism – the theological system which bridges the Calvinist-Arminian gap.

TWO DIFFERENT WORLDVIEWS





STARTING POINTS

Calvinism → **Sovereignty** requires Determinism.

Arminianism -> Sovereignty is absolute in authority.

Provisionism -> Sovereignty is absolute in authority.



STARTING POINTS

Calvinism \rightarrow **Dead** in sin and **unable** to believe.

Arminianism > <u>Tainted</u> by sin but <u>able</u> to believe.

Provisionism > <u>Depraved</u> in sin but <u>able</u> to believe.



DEAD IN YOUR SINS

You were **DEAD** in your offenses and sins, in which you previously walked according to the course of this world ...and were by nature children of wrath, just as the rest. Ephesians 2:1-3

...this son of mine was **DEAD** and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found. Luke 15:24



DEAD IN YOUR SINS

Does DEAD mean absolute cessation of life and zero ability?

OR

Does is DEAD a metaphor for zero adequacy and capacity?

Am I DEAD like Lazarus in the grave?

OR

DEAD like an iron worker at the end of a day's shift?



DEAD IN YOUR SINS

Scripture repeatedly invites and exhorts an individual to believe in Jesus Christ in such a way that the plain implication is that they are able to do so – they are "Response-Able."

Calvinism addresses this by speaking of 2 wills -

- the "declared" will of God What He desires to happen
- the "secret" will of God What He decrees to happen



Sovereignty is God's control over His creation. It is God's rule over all reality.

Nothing happens without God's willing it to happen, willing it to happen before it happens, and willing it to happen in the way that it happens.

No doctrine is more despised by the natural mind than the truth that God is absolutely sovereign. Human pride loathes the suggestion that God **orders** everything, **controls** everything, and **rules** over everything.

The carnal mind, burning with enmity against God, abhors the biblical teaching that nothing comes to pass except according to His eternal decrees.


Westminster Confession:

God, from all eternity, did, by the most wise and holy counsel of his own will, freely, and unchangeably ordains whatsoever comes to pass:

...yet so, as thereby **neither is God the author of sin**, nor is violence offered to the will of the creatures; nor is the liberty or contingency of second causes taken away, but rather established.




SOVEREIGNTY AS CAUSAL DETERMINISM





Admittedly, these truths are hard for the human mind to embrace, but Scripture is unequivocal. God **controls** all things, right down to choosing who will be saved.

Paul states the doctrine in inescapable terms in the ninth chapter of Romans,

CALVINIST SOVEREIGNTY OF GOD

- 100% of what exists and what happens is both caused and determined by God
- His creatures have no autonomous will because then God would be depending on the choices of another.
- If God is dependent on another's will and choices, then He is robbed of glory and not truly sovereign.



ELECTION

Election is God's sovereign choice of a person, group of people, or nation for His purposes. For instance, Israel is an elect (chosen) nation/people to fulfill a specific role.

Theological tension emerges from discerning whether God unconditionally chooses those whom He will save, or whether His choosing is that all who believe will be justified and glorified.

Calvinist Interpretation

Before Creation God decided which specific individuals He would save from eternal damnation. He predestined them to salvation and determined that they would be adopted into His family forever.



Non-Calvinist Interpretation

Before Creation God determined that those who are in Christ will be predestined to justification, adoption, and glorification.


